Alabama State Council Health Services Committee Blood Donation Program

Blood is the perfect gift. It is essential to the life of the recipient, it costs us nothing, and we get it back without our conscious action.

Every day, victims of war, disaster, disease, accident, and so on need blood. Every two seconds someone needs blood. There is no substitute for human blood. The only source of blood for victims is blood donated by volunteers. Of approximately 37% of the U.S. population are eligible donors across the US, less than 10 percent actually donate. In Alabama it is more like 4 percent.

Think for a moment about how many people you know who have had to have blood because of injury, surgery, serious illness, etc. Perhaps you, like I, have personally experienced the need for blood. In my case, my son is alive today because five anonymous persons had donated blood that he needed when he was born, and my daughter has had several transfusions.

The Health Services Committee's blood donation program has been active since our 2019 Convention. The award is point based. A Council gets one point for each Knight who gives blood during the Fraternal Year, ten points for hosting a blood drive, and an additional five points if the drive meets its goal. Points are recorded by designated person in each Council – perhaps the Community Programs Director. Blood drive activities are entered into the Blood Drive Program Log.

To reach the log,

Click on Programs, then Community, and then Blood Program Log,

Enter your name - not the names of the donors themselves - and the rest of the information,

Fill out the log entry for the number of donor(s) and if a blood drive hosted.

The numbers are tallied by the State Health Services Chair, the award is announced at the State Convention, and the award presented. Awards are presented to the Council and to the District with the largest numbers of donors for the fraternal year. The reporting period is from the Organizational Meeting to the next Convention.

I am sure that several other Councils have Brother Knights who have donated, or even hosted blood drives, but few have been to the blood program webpage and entered their activities.

During the first half of Fraternal Year 2020/2021, four Councils reported blood donation activities. Blood program activity results were reported in each month except September. Sixty-two pints of blood were donated by Knights, and three blood drives were hosted, which gathered a total of 77 pints of blood.

IMPORTANT DONOR DEFERRAL INFORMATION

At the onset of the COVID crisis, the FDA reevaluated its donor deferral rules for donors who lived in Europe. The new guidelines are:

The Health Services Committee will continue to encourage the saving of lives by donations of blood. District Deputies, please encourage your Councils to participate in this Community Program and report their blood donations.

Knights of Columbus Youth Activities

An active Youth Program lets the parish see that the K of C is more than fish fries and bingos. Food Drive for the Comunita Cenocolo From Danny Garcia, State Secretary

As the Christmas Season approached, our State Deputy was asked by Bishop Emeritus Baker if the State Council could organize a food drive for the Comunita Cenocolo located in Blountsville, AL. The State Deputy contacted me and asked if I could organize a food drive for the community and get the food to the community before Christmas. We had less than three weeks to get the project off the ground, food gathered, and delivered before it would become next to impossible to get volunteers because of the Christmas holidays.

So, what is Comunita Cenacolo? It is a community (https://www.hopereborn.org/) established by Mother Elvira in Italy as a source of hope and salvation not only for many who have been dependent on drugs and distractions, but also for those who crave to encounter a true answer to the suffering they have experienced. Bishop Emeritus Baker saw the immense value of this community and worked to get a community established here in Alabama as Bishop of the Diocese of Birmingham. It is the only community of Cenocolo in Alabama and it is located near the Shrine to the Blessed Sacrament in Blountsville, AL. This community is composed of young men, though there are others around the world composed of women as well.

While we have all faced unprecedented challenges last year that we never imagined, this difficult time has also served to underscore the importance of our humanity and kindness towards our fellow man.

Not knowing how long and what logistics would be needed to pull this project off in the short time that was given, I reached out to my Grand Knight, Jerome Villarreal from Council 10232 in Madison to see what could be done. Thanks to many prayers and generous hearts Council 10232 was able to collect an estimated 1200 pounds of food in a little under 2 weeks. It was delivered on the morning of December 18th by members of Council 10232 to the Cenacolo community.

When we arrived, we were greeted by some incredible young men of the community who are fighting various addictions. As it was explained to us, the community depends and lives totally on the Providence of God, who sustains them through the gifts and contributions of those who desire to help in the work of God's Mercy. We were all impressed with their inner sense of gratitude and joyful spirit that the community displayed.

Based on this positive experience, I am working to organize an ongoing system of support for this deserving community by North Alabama and Birmingham area KofC Councils. The envisioned plan is to develop a schedule where interested councils could each take a turn in gathering and delivering food, personal hygiene, and other needed items to the community on a quarterly basis.

MARIAN HOUR UPDATE

At the time of this writing, we still await Supreme's unveiling of the Blessed Michael McGivney Prayer Hour resource announced back on 10-December by Supreme's *SVP, Evangelization and Faith Formation*. The departure of Brother **Evan Holguin** is likely reason its release has been delayed beyond January. Brother Evan accepted a position with EWTN, duties he is able to perform from his current home near New Haven. Per earlier instructions received from Supreme, the two Marian icons in circulation in AL for the past 2½ fraternal years were surrendered to WSD Joe Flaherty. One of these has already been committed to its retirement home. Per Joe's direction at the midyear meeting however, the second icon remains available for any council desiring to host a service, subject to short-notice recall. He strongly urged its use to District Deputies.

Districts and Councils desiring to include this as one of their four faith programs on Form SP-7 should advise me directly of such desire. Councils not having had the opportunity of having the icon in their district due to having been scheduled for the second half of the fraternal year are especially encouraged to participate. Bear in mind that arrangements for its transport need to be made; I will facilitate this wherever possible.

Prayers for persecuted Christians remain sorely needed. In fact, Christians are not the only ones persecuted for seeking the path to God. Persecution of those of other faith traditions threatens Christians as well. I suspect that this may be the thrust of the St. Michael the Archangel devotion originally planned for the first of this calendar year. Until such a time, however, as large gatherings in the presence of a prayer icon are again prudent and possible, the virtual Bl. Michael McGivney Prayer Hour, once put into place, should be embraced by all. I will let all know when this happens.

In 2018, I was appointed ID Chairman for KofC Council 10232. As such, I found it harder and harder to do the usual ID drive events that had been established in the past, such as storefront Tootsie Roll displays etc. In researching the previous years beginning around 2012, I noticed that our numbers (collections) for Tootsie Roll drives had dropped significantly, some years as much as 80% from previous years because of stores not allowing Knights on their property for a variety of reasons. Some explained that it was a corporate policy, some saying it was a liability issue, etc.

So in 2018, we the council and assembly began trying to research alternative ways of generating funds. To use a cliche, "thinking outside the box." Dinners are always a way to generate funds, however the profit margins are not something that can always sustain such an effort. So we established a 5k race, The "Tootsie Roll 5K" https://runsignup.com/Race/AL/ Madison/KofCTootsieRoll5K?remMeAttempt=, in addition to establishing a project performing program, i.e. Yard Work, Tree Trimming, Deck Restoration, whatever we can do based on the level of experience within our council. We only ask for donations that go towards our charities.

Flash forward to 2020 and a global pandemic, which cuts even deeper into established events. Sit down dinners are no longer possible, everything has to be to go. Stores will definitely not let groups stand in storefronts to solicit donations. So we decided to ramp up our project efforts. Getting our name out though social media. This past weekend we tackled one of those projects and have since generated a great response from the community. We now have a couple of more projects in the queue.

We are coming into the Lenten Season and our scholarship funds that we generate through our fish fries, will also have to be supplemented because of the "new normal's" obstacles and constraints. We will make it happen. As our new Council and Assembly motto's state, "That's what we do at 10232!" TWWD@10232 and "We also do plenty at 2420" WADP@2420.
