REPORT OF THE 2022 RESOLUTION AND BYLAWS COMMITTEE

RESOLUTIONS

The committee reviewed several resolutions, which are summarized below. They are found in full in Appendix A of this document. The committee recommends adoption of all resolutions.

BYLAWS

The committee reviewed 22 changes to the bylaws. All changes were unanimously agreed upon by the committee, and the adoption of these changes is recommended.

In Article 1 the language was rephrased to simpler wording to be easier to understand.

In Article 2 the language was rephrased to simpler wording to be easier to understand. The requirement to send a list of delegates on Council stationary was struck to permit digital transmission.

In Article 3 the language was rephrased to simpler wording to be easier to understand.

In Article 4 the language was rephrased to simpler wording to be easier to understand. Section 9, defining the role of the State Chaplain was added.

In Article 5, Section 1, all language related to convention packages was removed. In Section 3 language permitting a designated subordinate council to host the convention was added. In Section 4 a typo error was corrected.

In Article 6 Section 1 a typo error was corrected. In Section 2 language was added to permit digital balloting. In Section 4 a typo error was corrected.

In Article 7 Section 3 the State Advocate is noted as serving as the chairman of the Resolutions committee. In Section 4 a typo error was corrected. In Section 7 the list of officers to receive mileage was corrected to reflect the current offices that exist as noted in Article 5 Section 1. In Section 8 the awards categories noted were aligned with the Faith in Action categories. In Section 9 a typo error was corrected.

In Article 8 Section 1 a typo error was corrected.

In Article 9 Section 2 was rewritten with simpler wording to be easier to understand. It now requires funds be deposited in fiscally conservative accounts instead of in institutions paying the highest interest rate. This simplifies management of accounts as rates change. In Section 3 language was added to allow for digital movement of funds in alignment with modern banking. In Section 6 a typo error was corrected.

In Article 11 submissions of changes to Bylaws and Resolutions will now be done digitally instead of submitting printed copies in triplicate.

In Article 13 Section 1 removed "or all" for submission requirement.
