Amendment to the Laws of the Supreme Council - Section 122(b)

BYLAWS

The committee reviewed 2 changes to the bylaws. All changes were unanimously agreed upon by the committee, and the adoption of these changes is recommended.

1. In Article 7, Section 8 the following paragraph be added:

For determining the number of members for awards based on the size of the Council, the "Inactive" members as classified by Supreme shall be excluded from the count.

2. Article 8, Section 4 to be amended as follows:

Citizens with Intellectual Disabilities (ID) Fund:

Once subordinate councils have completed their ID drive, **twenty per cent of** the net proceeds, after all expenses have been deducted, are to be sent to the State Treasurer and marked for Citizens with Intellectual Disabilities Fund. This should be done within thirty days after completion of the drive. **The remaining** *E*eighty percent of these funds *will be* **are** available for Council disbursement **at the Council's discretion** to local projects that benefit citizens with intellectual disabilities. The *remaining* twenty percent will be retained by the Alabama State Council, Knights of Columbus, for distribution to other projects that benefit citizens with intellectual disabilities.

AMENDMENT TO THE LAWS OF THE SUPREME COUNCIL

To Whom This May Come:

WHEREAS:	The Laws of the Knights of Columbus establish a structure of governance for the Supreme Council and all subordinate councils; and,
WHEREAS:	From time to time it is prudent to amend one or more sections; and,
WHEREAS:	Certain rules and procedures have been developed and, in some cases implemented, to address new issues and to ensure excellence in fraternal governance; and,
WHEREAS:	Based on the increased costs of materials and services, staying at \$500 postpones some of the works by the council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Knights of Columbus membership of the State of Alabama meeting on April 22, 2023 in Atmore, Alabama hereby asks the Supreme Council that in order to harmonize the Laws of the Knights of Columbus with certain new rules and procedures to amend the following sections of the Laws as follows:

Council Funds

SEC. 122.

(b) No money in excess of \$500.00 \$800.00 shall be paid or transferred from the treasury, of any council (except such moneys as the council is called upon to regularly pay for its current expenses and as provided by the laws of the Order, or for purposes approved by the Supreme Council, or Board of Directors) unless by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting at a monthly council meeting held subsequent to a monthly council meeting at which notice in writing of a resolution of intention to pay or transfer such money and the purposes and amount to be paid or transferred shall have been given and regularly read. Provided, however, that any council may, by bylaw, properly approved, provide and maintain a fund for rendering mutual aid and assistance to its sick, disabled and needy members and their families and families of deceased members. Said by-laws to state the manner in which, and by whom, the said fund is to be expended.
